## Winter Wheat Headed by State

Texas - 34% Oklahoma - 11% Kansas - 0 % Colorado - 0% Oregon - 0% South Dakota - 0% Nebraska - 0% Washington - 0% Wyoming - 0% Montana - 0% Idaho - 0%

## **State Updates**

Ohio- lots of rain and sunshine. Crop looks good.

**Maryland** – Dry period, people back in fields. Key Bridge hopes to open 1-35 foot channel by end of month. Impacts on supply.

**Texas** – 40% headed, warm temps. Windy/break from moisture moving crop. 38% G-E. Stripe rust concerns in Rolling Plains (moisture/warm temps). Wet/cool temps forecast.

**Oklahoma** – Stripe rust issues in SW OK (typically dryer but has seen moisture). Central OK, extremely dry. Northern/NW OK even dryer. 4 largest counties in NW 100 days less than <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> inch moisture – suffering. Moisture forecast for Central OK.

**Kansas** – drought across state. S/Central – NE seeing the worst. 1/3 jointed – expect earlier harvest than normal. Rain forecast late next week. No rust issues. Freeze concerns over the weekend in Northern KS. Fighting high temps/winds (50/60 MPH). Variable crop.

**Colorado** – Variable crop. High winds/high temps especially SE CO. Some abandonment. Crop is hanging on. NE Corner looking better than SE, but variable. Some cut worms/brown mites. Saw fly 3 – 4 weeks from emerging. Some moisture forecast. **Nebraska** – 70% G-E. Crop looks good, but concerns. Too good too early. 10 days – 2 weeks early. 10 days from jointing. Mixed weather across state - high temps/wind followed by some cool days. Panhandle receiving snow/mid-20s at night. Some light rains Central/Eastern NE.

**South Dakota** – Spring 23% planted vs. 13% avg. Widespread rain Monday/Tuesday. NE state wet, may see acreage reduction. Winter in good shape. Forecast dryer.


**North Dakota** – small % of spring in the ground. Temps declined past week. Rain across state (variable amounts). Northern 1/3 of state dry.

**Montana** – 70% breaking dormancy. Ahead of normal. Slight improvement in drought monitor. Production areas still abnormally dry. 56% G-E. May/June key for winter wheat. Spring/durum. Too wet to seed. Low 60s/70s forecast.

**Idaho** – Snow, rain wind this week – causing delay. 40% spring planted across state. 90% adequate/surplus in both topsoil and subsoil. No concern pest/disease concerns yet. Winter wheat looks good.


**Washington** – spring planting progress. On track for winter/spring. Overall winter crop 80% F-G. Dry across state. Spraying for winter. 40% complete spring planting. Winter kill in dry areas.

**Oregon** – Producers out in field. Good crop conditions. Port of Portland suspending T-6 container service in October (not seeing a lot of wheat going out of there but will see some downstream effects).
