



HRW Harvest Update

June 27, 2024

State Updates

MD – 52% harvested Sunday, closer to 65-70% today. 89% G-E, avg. yields high 80s-low 90s. No quality issues yet, but higher vomitoxin levels. Some rain. Expect harvest to wrap up next week or so.

TX – I-35 harvest progress, North of Dallas harvested, south of Dallas a lot of untouched fields, waiting for crop insurance. Almost everything at this point priced as feed wheat, 55 or lower TW, sprout 4%. Wheat is moving to feed mills/feed yards. Still seeing 40-50 bu yields, rain at harvest lowered. Rolling Plains finished by end of this week, slight drop in TW/little sprout. Main activity in Panhandle, big rain 1 week ago, highs in 100s/windy temps past few days. Lots of weed pressure, est 80% harvested, above avg. yields 80+ irrigated, dryland highly variable 20-60, highly variable proteins (even within same field) ranging 8-15, TW 60+, 12.5% pro avg.

KS – Hot weather, 53% Monday– wrapping up in S/Central, cutting in NW Corner now. Good yields except for drought area (west Central – central). Farmers with decent yields in Western KS (haven't seen much of a crop for a few years). Intermittent showers last night, storms forecast next 4 days – could pause harvest. Est. 75% harvested by Monday. Hearing good quality, pleased with milling/baking. Still lots of variability.

CO – Hot past 5-6 days (mid-90s/low 100s), windy. Harvesting in SE CO past 7-10 days. Yields, haven't had a crop for a few years, happy to see something. Quality est. 10-11% pro. Some storms last night delaying things, but think it will keep moving

WY – Trace rains. Hot/windy, crop maturing quickly, some harvesting expected weekend after July 4th. Avg. – above avg. crop, but still time. Possible severe weather this afternoon,

expecting cooler/damp weather pattern after the 4th.

ID – Spring heading, some of the winter wheat turning. Expecting harvest to start in some areas mid-July. Some frost last week, no major damage. SW looks really good, rains yesterday. 100+ temps for July 4th.

CA – 60-70% harvested. Sacramento area seeing 100 bu/ac, San Joaquin 125 bu/ac (typical for this area). More grain in Sacramento harvested this year. Not all millable/baking (organic going into feed yards, lack of organic wheat market in CA, need for organic seed for animal feed.)

SD – Slight uptick in spring and winter wheat conditions. USDA spring wheat acres tomorrow. Original 850,000 but not expecting that high, some wet conditions. Hearing some stripe/leaf disease reports. Recent rain in SE SD, some flood damage in S. Central, not seeing huge impact on wheat.


MT – Lots of wind, Sunday hit 100 degrees. Weird weather, cold/windy in middle of state. 70s/80s next week. Forecast looks good, scattered showers today. Some severe hail storms Friday, took out some areas. Winter crop above avg. crop is 7-10 days ahead of avg. Crop is looking good, no protein concerns yet. Abnormally dry in wheat production areas, but have had some timely rains. Spring/durum slightly ahead of normal. Spring looks good, expecting avg. crop.

OR – Officially started harvest end of last week in Morrow county (HRW acres). Cooler weather overall, normal timeframe for harvest schedule. Est. 2 weeks out in most growing areas. Expecting good quality/above avg. yields. Watching for wildfires. Challenged on prices.


Winter Wheat Headed by State


Winter Wheat Harvested by State

Kansas Weekly Harvest Report

The central parts of Kansas — from Dodge City to Great Bend to Hutchinson and beyond — were hit hard with the drought this spring. After missing rain during most of the growing season, John Hildebrand of Stafford reports rain finally came a couple weeks ago — after the wheat was ripe, which delayed the beginning of harvest.

The Hildebrands were able to start harvest on June 13 and were in the home stretch on the afternoon of June 24.


Oklahoma wheat harvest made good progress in the remaining parts of North Central and Northeast Oklahoma this past week and is pretty well wrapped up in the state except in the Panhandle. Some producers started test cutting again yesterday in the Panhandle and hope to start back up in the fields later this afternoon after the huge rain event last week. No reports on how test weights and yields have been impacted, but we hope to have a better idea with our planned harvest report on Monday, July 1, 2024.
